Before Opening	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① The school will be closed. During the issuance of evacuation orders based on tsunami warnings and major tsunami warnings, schools within listed areas will be closed. ② Please ensure the safety of each household by evacuating to a safe place. ③ We will suspend school attendance until we are notified of the resumption of school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① Including the implementation of classes on the day, attendance at school will be suspended until the school notifies us. ② After safety inspections of school facilities, school routes, etc., the school will contact you. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① Classes will be conducted as usual. (If it is difficult to ensure the safety of going to and from school, please refrain from going to school.)
Going to and from school	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① Staff will patrol school districts and provide evacuation guidance for students on their way to and from school. We will ensure safety by sending students home or guiding them to school or temporary evacuation sites. (If an earthquake or tsunami occurs before school, the staff will patrol the school district as soon as they come to work.) ② Students en route to school should evacuate to a safe place. (Please consult with your family about evacuation sites on the way to school.) ③ We will guide students in the school to evacuation sites, confirm the number of people, etc., and then protect them in a safe place. After that, we will follow procedures as outlined for earthquake/tsunami taking place while at school. (see below) 		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① As usual ② Staff will patrol the school district. (When going to school, the staff will patrol the school district as soon as they come to work.)
At school	<p>(The same procedures will be followed if some students are present in school due to early school, activities after leaving school, club activities on holidays, etc.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① We will guide students to evacuation sites, confirm the number of students, etc., and then protect them in a safe place. ② We will cancel classes and take measures to encourage students to leave school. ③ As a general rule, we will protect students until they are greeted by a guardian, family member, or person who has received a request from a guardian. (Even if there is no contact from the school, it is assumed a parent or guardian will come to pick you up.) ④ If an evacuation order based on a tsunami warning or a large tsunami warning is issued, we will evacuate to the designated evacuation site (Kairaku Park) based on the tsunami evacuation plan. We will protect students at the evacuation site until there is a meet and greet ceremony. Thereafter, students should remain at the evacuation site with their guardian until the evacuation order is lifted. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ② Depending on the circumstances of the damage, etc., we will determine whether classes can be continued and contact the parents. ③ If we send students home from school, we will contact their parents and judge depending on the situation whether to take measures such as regular dismissal from school, group disembarkation led by faculty and staff, or parental pick-up, etc. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ① As usual ② Staff will conduct safety inspections of school facilities, school routes, etc. <p>* Depending on the circumstances of the damage, etc., appropriate measures will be taken in accordance with categories 〈1〉 and 〈2〉 .</p>

※ About contact from school

Schools will contact you using the emergency contact method (Machikomi-mail), but depending on the situation, you may use the Disaster Message Dial (171).
